Maryland	X			For the Community Colleges, there is the Garrett/W. Va. reciprocity agreement is an interstate agreement between Maryland and West Virginia for the exchange of Maryland residents to Shepherd College and West Virginia University and West Virginia residents to Garrett College. This agreement allows West Virginia students to attend Garrett College at in-county resident tuition and fee rates. The current reciprocity agreement allows for the exchange of up to 125 FTES. The State shall pay to Garrett CC an amount equal to the net State support per FTE as provided in the Cade Formula funding for the current year. Uncertain about whether there are reciprocity agreements for the four-year public institutions.

Minnesota -- UM	X			Minnesota has statewide public post-secondary tuition reciprocity with Wisconsin, North Dakota, South Dakota and the Canadian province of Manitoba. There is also a limited tuition reciprocity agreement that includes one community college attendance district in northwest Iowa and five two-year public institutions in southwest Minnesota. All undergraduate programs of study are included in the agreements. Undergraduate students in the Minnesota/Wisconsin agreement pay tuition at the rate charged by a comparable home state institution. Undergraduates in the Minnesota agreements with North and South Dakota pay the higher of the two state tuition rates. Graduate students pay the higher of the two state tuition rates. Minnesota and Wisconsin and North Dakota make interstate tuition reciprocity payments based on student marginal instructional costs minus student paid tuition.

Nebraska pays the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition charges directly to the institutions for a specific number of students. Nebraska institutions also have individual agreements (not necessarily reciprocity) that allow residents of other states to attend at resident rates.

Undergraduate and graduate student exchange programs through WICHE and MHEC.

All 78 public colleges and universities in New England participate in offering hundreds of academic programs through RSP.
South Carolina	X			The University of South Carolina's Aiken Campus and Aiken Technical College may offer in-state tuition to any student whose legal residence is in the Richmond/Columbia County area of the neighboring state of Georgia as long as the Georgia Board of Regents continues its Georgia Tuition Program by which in-state tuition is offered to students residing in the (1) Aiken/Edgefield/McCormick County Area of the State of South Carolina; or (2) if the Georgia Board of Regents does not extend its Georgia Tuition Program to include McCormick County residents, then students residents in the Aiken/Edgefield County Area of the State of South Carolina.
South Dakota	X			We have reciprocity with Minnesota where students are allowed to move between states at the higher of the average resident rate of their home state or the visiting state. We also allow all students from WICHE states to attend all undergraduate programs at 150 percent of the resident rate.

Utah	X			1) Utah participates in the WICHE Western Undergraduate Exchange program, where students from other states can enroll in select programs at USHE institutions on a space available basis and pay 150 percent of resident tuition. 2) Utah State University has a reciprocal agreement with Idaho State University where the difference between nonresident and resident tuition is waived for 150 students. 3) Utah has had a statutory policy since 1986 where students who live within 100 highway miles of a USHE institution could attend that institution by paying half the difference between the resident and nonresident tuition rates.
